About This Booklet

This reference lists all 235 vocabulary words and phrases from Beginner Juba Arabic: A Complete Introductory Textbook, organised chapter by chapter, plus the 28 numbers from the Numbers Reference — 263 items in total. Each entry shows the Juba Arabic word or phrase, its English meaning with part of speech, IPA pronunciation, and a short example sentence.

Reading the IPA

IPA (International Phonetic Alphabet) shows exactly how to pronounce each word. Dots separate syllables — /sa.lam/ has two syllables: "sa" and "lam". Stress falls on the first syllable unless otherwise indicated.
